**TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST OUR HOLY FATHER JOHN CHRYSOSTOM,
ARCHBISHOP OF CONSTANTINOPLE (with tone 6)**

Troparion (6): Angelic powers were upon Your tomb and the guards became like dead men; Mary stood before Your tomb seeking Your most pure body. You captured Hades without being overcome by it. You met the Virgin and granted life. O Lord risen from the dead, glory be to You!

Troparion (8): Grace shone forth from your mouth like a fiery beacon and enlightened the universe, bestowing on the world not the treasures of greed, but rather showing us the heights of humility. As you teach us by your words, O John Chrysostom, our father, intercede with the Word, Christ our God, for the salvation of our souls.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion (6): From heaven you received divine grace; your lips have taught us all to worship the Triune God, O blessed John Chrysostom. It is fitting that we praise you; for you are a teacher, clarifying things divine.

Now and for ever and ever: Amen.

Kontakion (6): With His life-giving hand, Christ our God, the Giver of life, raised all the dead from the murky abyss and bestowed resurrection upon humanity. He is for all, the Savior, the Resurrection and the Life, and the God of all.

Epistle (Eph 2:4-10)

A reading from the Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Ephesians:

Brethren: God who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ (by grace you have been saved), raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL, ACCORDING TO SAINT LUKE

At that time, a lawyer stood up to test Jesus.

“Teacher,” he said, “what must I do to inherit eternal life?”

Jesus said to him, “What is written in the law? What do you read there?”

The lawyer answered, “**You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself.**”

And Jesus said to him, “You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.”

But wanting to justify himself, the lawyer asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”

Jesus replied, “A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance, a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two silver pieces, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, ‘Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.’

Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?”

He said, “**The one who showed him mercy.**”

Jesus said to him, “Now you go and do likewise.”

8. OBLIGATION TO ATTEND DIVINE LITURGY IS BEING RESTORED

On March 12, 2020, His Grace, Most Reverend Andriy Rabyi, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archeparchy, issued a Decree dispensing the obligation of attending Divine Liturgies for Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. This was due to the Coronavirus epidemic and in conjunction with other Dioceses and Eparchies in the United States. Since the weekend of June 6th & 7th, 2020, parishes were allowed to reopen for public worship in accordance with local health department regulations. Significant time has passed and even though there are still people contracting and suffering from this virus, public life has basically been restored and most restrictions have been lifted. With this in mind, this Decree is issued in order to lift the Dispensation granted on March 12, 2020. Beginning at the Philip's Fast (Advent) on November 15th, 2022, the obligation to attend the Divine Liturgy for Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is restored. Please be reminded that those not obligated to attend Divine Liturgies are those who are: 1. Sick or have a vulnerable health condition. 2. A caregiver for those who are sick or suffering from a vulnerable health condition. 3. Those confined to their home or care facility (hospital, nursing home, rehab center, etc.). 4. Those who have a serious reason to be excused or dispensed. Pastors are reminded to still practice safe measures to ensure the safety of those attending Divine Liturgies by utilizing the practices implemented during the pandemic when and if necessary. Pastors are encouraged to work with the parish Pastoral Councils to meet the needs of each parish.
