

- 5. UKRAINE INDEPENDENCE DAY THIS SATURDAY
 - Saturday, August 24th marks the 33rd anniversary of Ukraine's Independence. Prior to 1991, Ukraine was a constituent republic of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (U.S.S.R.). On August 24, 1991, after a failed coup in Moscow, Ukraine declared its independence. About 90 percent of Ukrainians voted for their country's independence following this declaration.
- 6. NEW CHURCH YEAR BEGINS NEXT SUNDAY
 - The church liturgical year begins on September 1st. The establishment of the new church year has a long history dating back to ancient Roman times. The Church Fathers at the First Council of Nicaea (325 AD), out of gratitude for the legalization and ability to openly profess the Christian faith, adopted this date as the beginning of the new church/liturgical year. The Eastern Catholic Church continues this practice of starting the new church year on September 1st.

 The Beheading of Saint John the Baptist, also known as the
 Beheading of the Forerunner, is a biblical event and holy day
 observed by various Christian churches that follow liturgical

 vengeful request of his step-daughter Salome and her mother



Our Second Invitation

"I'm counting on you," said a man to his best friend. The man had used his own good name and reputation to get a job for his friend who had been out of work. But, on the day the man was supposed to start his new job, he was late. After several days of arriving late, the man got fired from the job he had only one week: the job that his best friend had vouched for.

There are few things more disappointing than when our friends let us down. We see this in today's Gospel reading. A certain king invited his friends to a banquet, but when all was ready his friends declined to attend. More than being disappointed, the king was downright angry! His friends, who had accepted the initial invitation to attend, now made excuses when the banquet was

about to begin. In the culture in which Jesus lived declining an invitation after first accepting it was among the gravest of insults.

Our Lord extends a similar invitation to us. He says to each of us personally, "Follow Me." At our Baptism, our godparents accepted this invitation in our behalf. Throughout our life however, we have many opportunities to personally accept this invitation again and again. Each time we face a critical decision, each time we have a choice of good over evil, each occasion of trial or temptation, is an opportunity to accept or decline Christ's invitation to follow Him. Unlike the guests in today's Gospel reading, let us be among those who make right choices, not excuses.
