EPISTLE: Acts 20: 16-18, 28-36

"A reading from the Acts of the Holy Apostles."

In those days, Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus so as not to lose time in Asia, for he was eager to get to Jerusalem, by the feast of Pentecost if at all possible. Paul sent word from Miletus to Ephesus, summoning the presbyters of that church. When they came to him he delivered this address: "Keep watch over yourselves and over the whole flock the Holy Spirit has given you to guard. Shepherd the church of God, which he has acquired at the price of his own blood. I know that when I am gone, savage wolves will come among you who will not spare the flock. From your own number, men will present themselves distorting the truth and leading astray any who follow them. Be on guard, therefore. Do not forget that for three years, night and day, I never ceased warning you individually even to the point of tears. I commend you now to the Lord, and to that gracious word of his which can enlarge you, and give you a share among all who are consecrated to him. Never did I set my heart on anyone's silver or gold or envy the way he dressed. You yourselves know that these hands of mine have served both my needs and those of my companions. I have always pointed out to you that it is by such hard work that you must help the weak. You need to recall the words of the Lord Jesus himself, who said, 'There is more happiness in giving than receiving.'" After this discourse, Paul knelt down with them all and prayed. They began to weep without restraint, throwing their arms around him and kissing him, for they were deeply distressed to hear that they would never see his face again. Then they escorted him to the ship.

GOSPEL: John 17: 1-13

At that time Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come! Glorify your Son, that your Son may Glorify you, even as you have given him power over all flesh, in order that to all you have given him he may give everlasting life. Now this is everlasting life, that they may know you, the only true God, and the one you have sent, Jesus Christ. I have glorified you on earth; I have accomplished the work you have given me to do. And now do you, Father, glorify me with yourself, with the glory that I had with you before the world existed. I have manifested your name to the men you have given me out of this world. They were yours, and you have given them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they have learned that whatever you have given me is from you; because the words that you have given me I have given to them. And they have received them, and have known as a fact that I came forth from you, and they have believed that you

did send me. I pray for them; not for the world do I pray, but for those whom you have given me, because they are yours; and all things that are mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I am glorified in them. And I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep in your name those you have given me, that they may be one even as we are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in your name. Those you have given me I guarded; and not one of them perished except the son of perdition, in order that Scriptures might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you and these things I speak in the world, in order that they may have my joy made full in themselves."

Feast of the Ascension

The Icon of the Ascension is an artistic expression of the biblical accounts, written by St Luke in his Gospel (Luke 24:36-53) and the Book of Acts (Acts 1:1-12). On the fortieth day after His rising from the dead, the Lord goes to the Mount of Olives and departs and ascends into Heaven. Having fulfilled mission given to Him by the Heavenly Father, the Son of God returns home. Christ "ascended amidst shouts of joy; the Lord, at the sound of the trumpet." (First Antiphon). In the Third Antiphon, we pray: "You ascended in glory, O Christ Our God, giving joy to Your disciples by the promise of the Holy Spirit, and assuring them through Your blessing that You are the Son of God, the Redeemer of the world." In the Icon, the Mother of God, the Theotokos, is present along with the Apostles. Mary is our spiritual mother. She is the Mother of the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church. Mary uplifts Her hand in prayer and in honor to Her Son Who is returning home to the Heavenly Kingdom. Soon the Apostles will be empowered by the Holy Spirit to go out to all the nations, the entire world, and preach the good news of salvation, the Gospel message of Love and Truth, and baptizing them in the Name of the Blessed Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Alternate Ambo Prayer expresses the profound joy and significance of this in salvation history: "O Master, as we worship Your might (power). Lift up our thoughts towards Heaven, and raise our minds from earthly cares to Yourself, for You have lifted up our lowly nature in Yourself and enthroned it in the highest with the Father. Make us worthy here on earth as in Heaven to be concerned with seeking that which is on high, where You are seated at the right hand of God. We await Your glorious and awesome coming, which You have made known through the angels to the Apostles,

the witnesses of Your ascension into Heaven. Number us with those who will be taken up into the clouds to meet You when You come to judge the world in righteousness, that with them we may be filled with joy forever." - Father D. George Worschak


