Feast of Pentecost

On the fiftieth day after the Resurrection of Our Lord we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost. This Feast is one of the major feasts in the Church, both East and West. It is on this day that the Church had begun. Christ our Lord founded the Church and is the invisible Head of the Church. Our Savior had instructed and prepared His Apostles for this day. In Acts 1:4, Jesus tells them to remain in Jerusalem "to wait for the promise of the Father, about which you have heard Me speak." St. Luke writes about the twelve apostles along with the Blessed Virgin Mary were at prayer in the upper room. (Acts 1:13-14) The Holy Spirit came in the form of tongues of fire. In Acts 2:3, we read: "Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. The Holy Spirit, the Third Divine Person of the Most Blessed Trinity, enlivens us and gives us strength, a new face (outlook) and make us a new creation... Having received the Holy Spirit, St. Peter is able to go out and begin preaching the Good News with the fullness of power, with the fullness of the Holy Spirit. Peter had begun to preach about the joyous news of salvation. How Our Lord redeemed mankind by His death and Resurrection. For Christ had conquered death by His death and granted us new life. The Holy Spirit gives witness to Christ. The Lord tells His Apostles: "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit that the Father will send in My name—He will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." We Christians, faithful and dedicated followers of Christ, are to grow and develop with the grace of the Holy Spirit, so that we might liken ourselves to Christ Himself. And as such we are able to withstand the temptations of the evil one, the devil, and to stay away from sin and remain faithful to Christ and His teaching. We have put on Christ. We have welcomed the Holy Spirit into

our hearts and act in the spirit of Christ so as to prepare oneself for eternal life with God in the eternal Kingdom of Heaven. A devout spiritual life keeps us on the straight and narrow path leading to the Kingdom of God. May the Holy Spirit come to live within us and to guide and protect us all the days of our earthly life. And this we pray that all of us faithful may be deemed one day worthy of entry into the Kingdom of God, where we shall meet the Lord face-to-face.

Epistle: Acts 2: 1-11

"A reading from the Acts of the Holy Apostles."

When the day of Pentecost came it found the Apostles gathered in one place. Suddenly from up in the sky there came a noise like a strong, driving wind which was heard all through the house where they were seated. Tongues as of fire appeared, which parted and came to rest on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to express themselves in foreign tongues and make bold proclamations as the Spirit prompted them. Staying in Jerusalem at that time were devout Jews of every nation under heaven. These heard the sound, and assembled in a large crowd. They were much confused because each one heard these men speaking his own language. The whole occurrence astonished them. They asked in utter amazement, "Are not all of these men who are speaking Galileans? How is it that each of us hears them in his native tongue? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites. We live in Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the regions of Libya around Cyrene. There are even visitors from Rome – all Jews, or those who have come over to Judaism; Cretans and Arabs too. Yet each of us hears them speaking in his own tongue about the marvels God has accomplished."

Gospel: John 7: 37-53; 8: 12-13

Now on the last, the great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Anyone who believes in me, as Scripture says, 'From within him there shall flow rivers of living water." He said this, however, of the Spirit, whom they who believed in him were to receive; from the Spirit had not yet been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified. Some of the crowd, therefore, when they had heard these words, said, "This is truly the Prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." Some, however, said, "Can Christ come from Galilee? Does not the Scripture say it is of the offspring of David, and from Bethlehem, the village where David lived, that the Christ is to come?" So there arose division among the crowd because of him. And some of them wanted to seize him, but no one laid hands on him. The attendants therefore came to the chief priests and Pharisees; and these said

to them, "Why have you not brought him?" The attendants answered, "Never has man spoken as this man." The Pharisees then answered them, "Have you also been fooled? Has anyone of the rulers believed in him, or any of the Pharisees? But the crowd, which does not know the Law, is accursed." Nicodemus, the man who had come to him at night, who was one of them, said to them, "Does our Law judge a man unless it first gives him a hearing, and knows what he does?" They answered and said to him, "Are you also a Galilean? Search and see that out of Galilee arises no prophet." And again Jesus spoke to them saying, "I am the Light of the world. Anyone who follows me does not walk in the darkness, but will have the light of life."


