LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR UKRAINIAN GREEK CATHOLICS IN THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC METROPOLIA OF THE U.S.A.

In accordance with the "Pastoral Guidelines of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States of America," here are the regulations that are to be followed by all Ukrainian Greek Catholics during The Great Fast (Lent):

STRICT ABSTINENCE is to be observed on the first day of the Great Fast, and on Good Friday. The law of strict abstinence forbids the use of meat, eggs, and dairy products. Put simply, no meat or dairy all day long on these two sacred days.

SIMPLE ABSTINENCE is to be observed every Friday during Lent. The law of simple abstinence forbids the use of meat. Put simply, no meat all day long on Lenten Fridays.

Simple abstinence (no meat) is strongly encouraged on the Wednesdays of the Great Fast.

The following are exempt from abstinence: the poor who live on alms; the sick and frail; those convalescing; women who are pregnant and mothers who are nursing; those who perform hard labor; children under the age of 8; and those who are 59 or older, (only with the permission of their pastor or confessor). If you are not in the above exceptions, you are bound to Lenten fasting. If your pastor has not specifically given you permission to not fast, you are bound to Lenten fasting by our church rules.

Also, for the course of the time period beginning with the First Day of Lent until Easter Sunday, we are strictly forbidden from participation in festive activities like: wedding receptions, parties, dances, and raucous celebrations. The spirit of Lent calls for a prayerful and solemn atmosphere.
