6. TRADITIONAL ANNUAL RETREAT OF THE CLERGY TOOK PLACE IN NEW JERSEY

The theme of this year's retreat, attended by 34 priests, was a reflection on the Gospel of St. Luke the Evangelist. Bishop Paul Chomnycky of the Stamford Eparchy of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, directed the retreat. One of the Gospel readings from St. Luke was the story of Jesus' call for fishermen to follow him. "Jesus comes not to drive people away, but to call everyone and us to join him: no matter who we are, no matter how sinful we feel, we are, no matter what our life circumstances are. So, Jesus' call is not only to conversion but also to inclusion. I think this scene on the boat with Peter that you know is a symbol or should be a symbol of what our churches should be. Our parishes should be like places of inclusion and not exclusion."

8. ARCHBISHOP BORYS AMONG THOSE WHO MET WITH UKRAINIAN PRESIDENT

During his visit to the United States of America, President of Ukraine, Volodymyr Zelenskyy, met with the Ukrainian community in New York. Archbishop Borys Gudziak, Metropolitan of Philadelphia, took part in the meeting, representing the Ukrainian Catholic community in the United States. During his remarks to the attendees, Zelensky noted that he considers them the best ambassadors of Ukraine, "because you are defending our state, our sovereignty, territorial integrity abroad." Archbishop Borys gifted the President and his wife Olena a Ukrainian translation of Fr. Henry Nouwen's "Ukrainian Journals" recently published. Henry Nouwen (1932–1996) was a Dutch priest, teacher, and one of the most famous theological writers of our time. The last ten years of his life he lived with people with mental disabilities in the L'Arche-Daybreak community in Toronto (Canada).

Life's Choices

Native Americans have a legend about the two paths one can take in life. One path is broad and easy and slopes down rolling hills. At the bottom of the hill, however, is a barren dessert where nothing lives. The other path is narrow and rocky. It winds around dangerous curves and is filled with unexpected difficulties. However, at the end of this path is the lush greenness of life and happiness.

The Native Americans told this story to their children in order to teach them that the easy way is not always the best way. Strong character is built by facing obstacles, not by avoiding them. In the same way, Christians grow in virtue and grace often through facing trials and struggles.

The life of the holy martyr Charitina

is witness to this lesson. She was a young orphan girl – of great beauty – who was raised by devout Christian parents. At an early age she made the decision to dedicate her life to Christ in perpetual virginity. Through her example, many others were converted to Christ. This infuriated the pagan emperor who ordered that the hair of this beautiful servant of God be cut off and that hot coals be placed upon her head. She endured this and other inhumane and degrading tortures until the Lord took her soul to abide with Him in Paradise.

Her path in life was not an easy one, but it was the right one. Upon which path do the decisions that we make in life place us? Do we choose merely the easy path or the path that leads to Life?
