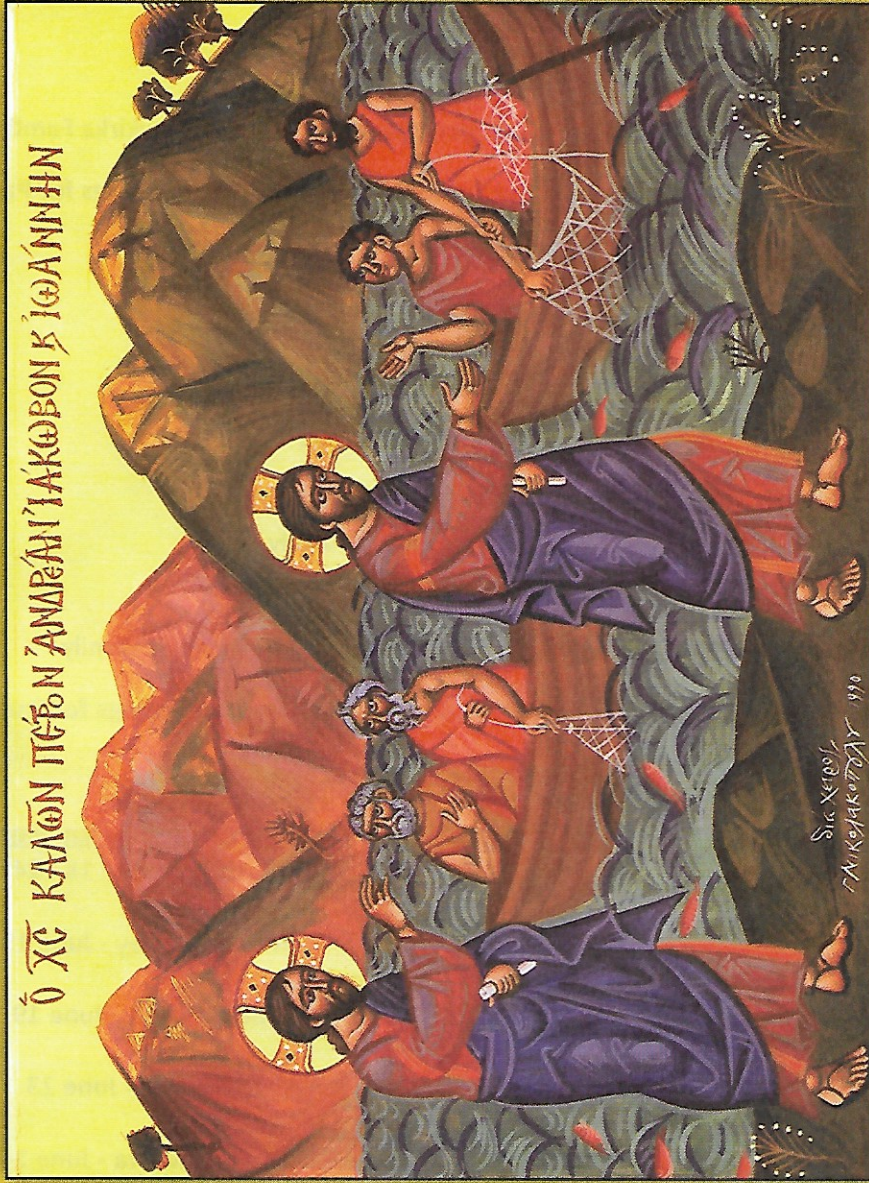

Heartfelt Words from Non-Ukrainian Donors

Russia's invasion and war-making have thrust Ukraine into the popular imagination in unprecedented ways. Millions and millions of people around the world, who would not otherwise have paid much attention at all to Ukraine, now closely follow news updates about the war and its victims. Major news sources now regularly mention cities and towns

like Chernihiv, Mariupol, and Yavoriv which were once obscure to the average North American. Archbishop Borys has played an important role in educating the public about the injustices and plight suffered by Ukraine. The Associated Press, Catholic Philly, CNN, EWTN, and other media outlets have brought his voice to new audiences. Members of these new audiences are neither Ukrainian Catholic nor part of the Ukrainian diaspora. Yet they have given generously to the Archeparchy of Philadelphia's Humanitarian Aid Fund, which has raised more than \$5,000,000 to date. Many of the Humanitarian Aid Fund's donors are

Roman Catholic while others are Jewish, Protestant, or have no reported religious affiliation. A number took time to compose letters and notes to enclose with their checks, and these contain some of the most heartfelt words in support of Ukraine. Amid violence and death, sadness and mourning, their messages demonstrate that Ukrainians are not alone. The war has galvanized people of good will who are committed to assisting through prayer, awareness, and financial support. May God bless our the Humanitarian Aid Fund's benefactors and suffering Ukrainian in great need! The following excerpts provide a sense of the beautiful sentiments held by non-Ukrainian donors to the Humanitarian Aid Fund.

What Have We Left Behind?

Most successful people would probably tell you that what separates great people from ordinary people is that great people are willing to risk making decisions, whether right or wrong, and then acting on those decisions. Great people are people who have made great choices, often very risky choices, but in the long run their choices have usually been right. Biblical history is peopled with folks who were confronted by decisions they had to make.

Just imagine the decision required of those fishermen on the shores of Lake Galilee. Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John were fishermen, true, but they were businessmen. Perhaps even prosperous businessmen. Fish was a staple in the diet, and fishermen could often make a very good living. The brothers Peter and Andrew were

probably business partners with the brothers James and John and most likely had a good business going. So when Jesus said to the two sets of brothers, "Follow me," He was not calling them to leave a sport, or a hobby; he was asking them to leave their careers, their livelihoods, and their families! They had everything to lose.

What have we left behind to follow Him? Unless there's some pain, some discomfort, some sacrifice, then most probably we haven't left anything. Perhaps we're still fumbling about in our boats, tossing our nets over the side, and business goes on as usual.

Yet, if we do that, the Great Fisherman might leave us and move on to someone else, and the choice might go by forever.
