8. THREE HOLY HIERARCHS JANUARY 30TH

The three Holy Hierarchs are pillars of the church. Living in and around the 300s, Sts. Basil, Gregory and John Chrysostom were great theologians during their age. And not only were they highly acclaimed during their time, but we continue to read their words and be inspired by their lives today. While each of these great men have their own feast days, we celebrate them together on January 30th. There was Basil, who admired the saint's ability to clearly communicate the mysteries of our faith. Gregory was the closest to achieving theosis. Finally, John Chrysostom, who wrote with such eloquence that we are still using his Divine Liturgy today. One night, a bishop named John Mauropous had a dream where the three holy hierarchs appeared. The three holy hierarchs explained that they are all equal before God. The saints requested that they would be celebrated together on a single feast day. And that is how we came to have the feast of the 3 Holy Hierarchs. Divine Liturgy will be held at 9:00am on Monday.

PROPERS SUNDAY OF THE PUBLICAN & PHARISEE

TROPARION & KONTAKION:

When the disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the glorious news of the resurrection and cast off the ancestral condemnation, they proudly told the Apostles: "Death has been plundered! Christ our God is risen, granting to the world great mercy."

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. Now and forever and ever. Amen.

Let us bring sighs of sorrow to the Lord as did the Publican and approach the Master as sinners, for He desires salvation for everyone. He grants forgiveness to all who repent. For as God, the One-who-is, co-eternal with the Father, He became flesh for us.

EPISTLE 2 Timothy 3:10-15

A Reading from the Second Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to Timothy

My son, Timothy, you know what I teach and how I live. You know what I want to do and what I believe. You have seen how patient and loving I am, and how in the past I put up with trouble and suffering in the cities of Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra. Yet the Lord rescued me from all those terrible troubles. Anyone who belongs to Christ Jesus and wants to live right will have trouble from others. But evil people who pretend to be what they are not will become worse than ever, as they fool others and are fooled themselves.

Keep on being faithful to what you were taught and to what you believed. After all, you know who taught you these things. Since childhood, you have known the Holy Scriptures that are able to make you wise enough to have faith in Christ Jesus and be saved.

GOSPEL (Luke 18: 10-14)

The Lord told this parable: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, the one a Pharisee and the other a publican. The Pharisee stood and began to pray thus to himself: 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of men, robbers, dishonest, adulterers, or even like this publican. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all I possess.' But the publican, standing far off, would not so much as lift up his eyes to heaven, but kept striking his breast, saying, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went back to his home justified rather than the other; for anyone who exalts himself shall be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself shall be exalted."

It is with brotherly sadness but with true Christian hope in the Resurrection of our Lord that I share with you news of the dormition of His Excellency Most Reverend Ivan Bura, Auxiliary Bishop-Emeritus of the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia. Bishop Ivan was called to the Lord today, January 17th at 3:30 PM after an extended hospital stay having received the Sacraments. Bishop Ivan gave his life to God, to the Church, and to our Archeparchy. We pray for the peace of his soul. We thank God for his life and service. Our dear Bishop Ivan, a thoughtful kind man, lived his final years at St. Josaphat Seminary accompanied with great solicitude by Father Rector Robert Hitchens. We express our heartfelt condolences to Bishop Ivan's brothers: Nicholas, Theodore and his wife Joyce, Walter and his wife Mary Anne, and sister Rosalie and her husband Eugene Naumenko, to the entire Bura family, and all friends of the deceased. A funeral Divine liturgy was celebrated on Tuesday, January 24th. After the Liturgy, the remains of Bishop Bura were transferred to St. Andrew Cemetery in Bound Brook, NJ for internment.
