

6TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

This Sunday's Gospel reading is from the Gospel of St. Matthew (9:1-7) Here the emphasis is on the power or authority of Jesus as Son of Man, Son of God, to heal and to forgive sins. Unlike the account recorded in the Gospel of St. Luke, there is no mention of the paralytic being carried by four men nor is there mention of having to cut an opening in the roof to lower the paralytic on a pallet and place him before Jesus. St. Matthew highlights the fact for us that Jesus as the Son of God, is God Himself, the Almighty. As such He can do akk things, cure, heal the one physically weakened, being unable to walk. And this He does by the power of His Word. Just as God had created the universe and all that is contained therein, by the Son of God's word, the paralytic is healed. Jesus says to the paralytic: "Rise, pick up your stretcher, and go home." (9:6) Once again it is faith that is needed for the miracle, the healing, to occur. Jesus sees "their faith," the faith of those present, the faith of the community. Jesus then calls the paralytic "child": "Courage, child, your sins are forgiven." (9:2) A reaction from the scribes who were present: "This man blasphemes." (v.3) The scribes considered themselves experts on the Old Testament law. For one thing, they lacked humility. Not also showed little to no compassion, expecting others to keep a strict observance of the law that They themselves could not or would not keep. Their reasoning was: Only God can forgive sin. And that is correct, for sin is first and foremost an offense against God, a transgression of one or more of the Ten Commandments. What the scribes failed to recognize or admit is that Jesus is the Son of God, He is God Himself, the Almighty and thereby has the power and authority to do so. Therefore, the scribes are wrong in saying that Jesus "blasphemes." We can readily notice that there are two opposite reactions to Jesus' cure of the paralytic. Not all shared the negative reaction of the scribes towards Jesus. In fact, we are told: "When the crowds saw this, they were awestruck and glorified God Who had given such authority to men (humans)." (v.

8) May our reaction to the marvelous deeds of the Lord God evoke a positive response of awe and wonder and lead us to thank the Lord for His expression of mercy and compassion.

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

Rise and Walk

It is easier said than done. Whether the sins of the paralytic were forgiven, only He who forgave them knew for sure. "Arise and walk." Both he who arose and those who saw him arise were able to vouch for this. Hence there is a bodily sign in order to demonstrate a spiritual sign, though its impact is to curb the imperfections of body and soul. And we are given an understanding of sin and many bodily weaknesses to come. Perhaps, too, sins are forgiven first, so that with the causes of infirmity removed health may be restored.

Furthermore, so it could be understood that He was in a body and that He could forgive sins and restore health to bodies, Jesus said, "That you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins," then He said to the paralytic, "Arise, take up your pallet." He could have simply said "Arise," but since the reason for doing every work had to be explained, He added, "Take up your pallet and go home." First He granted remission of sins; next He showed His ability to restore health. Then, with the taking up of the pallet, He made it clear that bodies would be free from infirmity and suffering; lastly, with the paralytic's return to his home, He showed that believers are being given back the way to paradise from which Adam, the parent of all, who became profligate from the stain of sin, had proceeded.
